Introduction

In the summer 2006 the topic **PagePeel** (also called **Magic Corner, Peel Ad, and peel away ad**) comes up as a new interesting advertising form on websites. This Module is based on Christian Harz, Webpicasso media Pageear that is distributed as a freeware (<http://www.webpicasso.de>). All the things that you should do are providing 2 pictures (one 100 × 100 for the time pageear is not opened and one 500 × 500 PX for the time pageear is opened) that's all. You can have a Specific Instance of this module on each page, or simply show pageear on every pages of your portal.

System Requirement

DOTNETNUKE COMPATIBILITY (4.x)

Markit Pageear is compatible with all versions above 4.5.5 at time of this documentation release, the latest DNN version is 4.8.4

NO CHANGES TO CORE

Markit Pageear does not require any changes to DotNetNuke Core files neither any edits are required to web.config

Installation

Markit Pageear Installation is same as any other standard DotNetNuke module Install.

All you have to do is upload the archive file to the DotNetNuke portal, and it will install it for you. To have security access to upload a module, you must **login as the host** manager account (default name is host), go to the **host menu** and select the **Module Definitions**.

Inside the Module Manager, select the **Upload New module or Install New Module** at the bottom - or select the same in the action menu which you enable by pointing the mouse to the edit image (pencil) in the upper left corner and a drop down menu will be displayed. Use the browse button to select the module archive file on your own computer. Press the **Add** and then the **Upload New File** link or **Save File** link.

The screen will now be full of installation messages, check that no errors are reported and it says **Success** at the bottom.

Module is now installed and you can place it on any page like the built in modules.

Note: When downloading modules which includes source code or named like UnzipMe, the zip file normally contains the Documentation and a zip file for installing a module. This installable zip file normally has **PA** in the name, which indicates that it contains a DotNetNuke **Private Assembly** Plug-in module.

Un-installation

Markit Pageear Un-installation is same as any other standard DotNetNuke module Uninstall.

To have security access to uninstall a module, you must **login as the host** manager account (default name is host), go to the **host menu** and select the **Module Definitions**.


Inside the Module Manager, edit the module by pointing the mouse to the edit image (pencil) next to module name. Towards the middle of the page, check the "Delete Files" checkbox if it's available and then click on **Uninstall** link.

Your module is now uninstalled.

Add Markit Pageear to a page

Markit Pageear can be added to a page just like standard DotNetNuke modules.

Simply select pageear from control panel and add it to the page.

Setting Up the Markit Pageear

Note: You must be logged in as an administrator or super user to access control panel.



Settings link appears underneath Pageear Module. Simply click on this link to Modify Pageear Settings.

Note: If your module doesn't show **Settings** link then your container might not support Action Buttons.

Alternatively, you can hover your mouse over the little arrow at top left of the module and click on **Settings**.

By Clicking on the **Settings** link, you will be directed to **Pageear Settings Page**. At the end of this page you can see **Pageear Settings**.

Markit Pageear

Pageear Settings is including three Sections:

Display: Specify how Pageear should be displayed.

Image: Specifying two Pictures.

Sound: Specify Mp3 Files to play by Pageear.

Display

Display Section Contains Following Properties:

Mirror:

Enabling this option causes a mirror of small and big image appears on the peel.

Close by click:

Enabling this option causes a Close link appears on the pageear when it is opened and Pageear would be closed only by clicking on this link.

Speed:

Normally Pageear has a Movement while mouse is not hovered on it, you can specify speed of this movement by selecting one of Items between 1 to 4. 1 means very fast and 4 means too slow.

Color:

Pageear can have a custom color on the peel. A Color Picker placed for this property to make easy selecting colors for you.

Open Automatically:

If you wish Pageear Opens Automatically after # seconds of time, here is the place you can specify this. This time can be 0 to 99.

Note: Entering 0 makes this property disable and pageear only opens when mouse hovered on it.

Markit Pageear

Close Automatically:

If you specified a time for open automatically. In this part you can specify the time peel should be opened. This time can be 0 to 99.

Direction:

Pageear can be shown on the Top Right or Top Left Corner of the page.

SoftFadeIn:

Fade in pageear if the image completely loaded. Value can be 1 to 5.












URL:

Entering an URL, causes to pageear acts as a hyperlink. And by clicking on the pageear, browser will be redirected to the URL you specified before.

Target:

If you specified a URL to open, here you can set browser target. Checking this property means a new window will be opened by clicking on the pageear.

Image Section Contains Following Properties:

Small Image:

you should select or upload small picture which you desire to be displayed on the pageear when Pageear is not opened. Supported Image formats are **JPG, JPEG** and size of this picture should be 100 × 100 pixel.

Big Image:

you should select or upload big picture which you desire to be displayed on the pageear when Pageear is opened. Supported Image formats are **JPG, JPEG** and size of this picture should be 500 × 500 pixel.
